### ROADS, RECYCLING & REMINDERS

The excellent condition of our roads following the winter months is a tribute to constant attention and effort by our 11- man Highway Department which includes Superintendent Bob Schwarz and 10 employees, assisted by seasonal help. Lloyd Harbor is the second largest village in area in NY State . We have 26 miles of public travel lanes. In a bad winter we can use roughly 600 tons of sand and 250 tons of salt to keep our roads clear. The Highway Department is responsible for the following: refuse pick-up twice weekly, recycling twice monthly; all plowing and road repair; maintenance of the grounds of our public buildings, roadside verges; maintenance /repair of our Harbor Patrol boat & navigational aids; and maintenance of our beautiful 75 acre Village Park. The Park gives all properties in the Village access to waterfront, tennis courts, docking facilities and an excellent summer camp program.

**ROADS:** Our roads are repaired and resurfaced on a rolling basis so that we do not incur the expense of deferred maintenance and serious deterioration. Work scheduled for **Summer 2016** includes:

- **Re-paving of Mill Road & School Lane;**
- **Jennings Road – Suffolk County Water Authority plans to do work this summer. Re-paving will take place after the work is complete, which will be late spring/summer of 2017.**
- **Guide rail replacement at the base of Lloyd Lane**

Of interest, **Sup't Schwarz has been successful in having PSE&G install an Osprey nest platform** at the base of Seminary Hill, across from the entrance to the Village Park.

**RECYCLING:** Our waste disposal contacts have now gone to single stream recycling. This has no effect on our sanitation schedule, amount of equipment or manpower required. However, residents can now co-mingle the following **in cans weighing less than 50 lbs:**

**Glass \* Plastic \* Paper (newspapers/magazines) \* Metal cans (empty)**

**The possibility exists that single-stream recycling may be** abandoned in the not-too- distant future by our disposal contacts. Therefore, if you have a separation system that you like, you may want to continue it.

**Pick-up of appliances, both small & large (toasters, microwaves, refrigerators, etc.) and E-waste (computers, TV's & all electronics) is by appointment only. There is \$25 fee applied for the pickup of larger appliances. Call the Highway Dep't at 631-549-8880 to schedule an appointment.**

**REMINDERS: Chief Flynn & the Officers of the LHPD** remind residents of the following:

- **Medication Disposal:** medications in pill or powder form (no liquids) can be disposed of at the LHPD. Please do not contaminate our water supply by flushing these items down the toilet or sink.
- **Vehicles left in driveways** should be locked at night, & the keys & any valuables removed.
- **Stickers are required at the Village Park.** Vehicles without 2016 stickers are subject to ticketing. Stickers are available at the Village Hall, and at the Park after Memorial Day. Fee is \$35 per sticker. Proof of residency required.
- **Village speed limit is 35 MPH.** Summer is coming and with it increased vehicle and pedestrian traffic. Please drive carefully!
