Village Hall: A beautiful renovation of our historic Village Hall, the former barn /carriage house on the Jennings' estate, is finally complete. The result includes re-location of the Building Dep't to ground floor; re-configuration of office space for Village Hall Staff to provide much needed Staff workspace & an office for the Clerk/Treasurer; re-location of restrooms & storage closets to a separate hallway. *Tremendous thanks to Clerk Jill Cervini & Village Hall Staff* for successfully running all operations, for 13 months, from the very cramped & congested main hallway – resulting in both a significant cost savings & elimination of the inconvenience that would have resulted from a move to temporary trailers !

The Seminary: The Mayor's Message of October '23 advised of the 3-party agreement which will prevent future development of this beautiful, environmentally sensitive site. Completion of this transaction will require several steps, the first being the Seminary's application for sub-division. We will keep you advised as to further developments.

Police Station: Long-time residents remember the "Police Booth" at the intersection of West Neck & Mill Roads. The location is commemorated now by the Millstone & seasonal garden displays. Built about 1928 the "Police Booth" - a ground level stationhouse with detention cells underneath - served Lloyd Harbor until the 1960s. Con't

From the Mayor.....Police Station

In 1965 construction began on the current LHPD Stationhouse. The land on which it stands was aquired from the Rankin family and the Victorian house on the property was razed. For nearly 60 years the Stationhouse has served the Village well, but the building is seriously in need of renovation & upgrading to accomodate the needs of a 13 member Police Force & Village Court personnel; the requirements & technical enhancements of modern police operations; oversight of the activity resulting from the tremendous increase of non-resident vehicles & visitors entering our Village most often to visit Caumsett State Park. Renovations will retain the classic apearance of the existing building.

Renovations include:

- redesign of interior to facilitate training & remote conferencing; emergency operations center; upgraded communications systems
- new roof
- compliance with NYS Dep't of Corrections & OSHA requirements
- replacement of substandard locker rooms
