✓ **Telecommunications Ordinance Adopted**

The 1996 Federal Communications Act and recently proposed federal regulation are extremely favorable to the telecom industry. For instance, attempts to block equipment installation based upon health concerns have been legally pre-empted, effectively restraining local control. That said, there exist methods by which a municipality can put order to the process, and establish a way to address the aesthetic, environmental and financial impacts of installation efforts.

At the November Board of Trustees meeting the Village adopted a comprehensive ordinance regarding telecommunications which is designed, to the fullest extent possible, to achieve these ends.

CAUSEWAY REPAIRS



Tremendous thanks to **Highway Superintendent Robert Schwarz** and the **Highway Department** on the repairs to the causeway and walking path. Severe damage & erosion resulted from a late winter storm in March and the continued impact of wind-driven waves. Almost 1,600 tons of stone and rip-rap were used in order to create a new break-water and inhibit erosion.

Using heavy equipment and doing repairs themselves, the **Highway Department** saved the Village roughly \$400,000. We are most grateful for the Highway Department's efforts and expertise! Maintenance and replanting along the walking path will continue in the Spring.

All kayaks and dinghies should have been removed from the racks by December 1st. Repairs to the rack are made during the winter. Any boats remaining will be removed and disposed of by the Highway Department.

SPAT BAGS

During the summer spat bags, containing juvenile oysters, were placed at a number of sites around Long Island including Lloyd Harbor. This was done under the direction of Adelphi University's Biology Dept. Monitoring of the spat bags will continue through December. Spat bags enhance the growth of young oysters. Oysters have tremendous filtering capabilities, enhancing water clarity and reducing pollution.

RECYCLING CHANGES



Important Information - Please Note!

The Village is part of a consortium which handles our recycling needs,
consisting of Smithtown, Brookhaven, & Southold.

One of the main recycling vendors has ceased operation. We have been advised
of the following in order to provide the most cost-effective and efficient recycling services,
and adhere to new standards of purity, cleanliness & non-contamination
(glass breakage mixed with plastics/metal) of recyclable material.

Please note that these standards are outside of Village control.

Effective January 1, 2019:

Dual-stream recycling is in effect.

The following materials must be separated:

- **CLEAN PAPER, NEWSPAPERS, MAGAZINES & CORRUGATED CARDBOARD** (flattened.)
(No wax-coated containers; no food-stained paper/cardboard)
- **METALS & PLASTICS** (exclude all glass)

*New standards have resulted in the exclusion of all glass from
our recycling program.*

Glass can be discarded or dropped at the:

Huntington Recycling location, 641 New York Avenue, Huntington, NY.
