Areas which will be renovated are the main office space which will include an office area for the Village Clerk and reconfiguration of access to the restrooms. As part of this plan the Building Department will also be relocated to the ground floor for easier access.

The Trustees are very proud of the fact that this reconfiguration of space will address the deficiencies of the current office, while retaining, from the exterior, the exact look of our historic Village Hall.

Village Hall was originally the carriage house of the Walter Jennings estate, *Burrwood*. Jennings, President of Standard Oil of New Jersey, purchased a 1,000-acre tract of land high on the bluffs overlooking Cold Spring Harbor. During 1902-04 he built his beautiful estate, *Burrwood*, on this location. The history of *Burrwood* is recounted in the Village publication, "Tales of Old Lloyd Harbor" (Avon Press, Hauppauge, NY 2001.) Village Hall and Jennings Field comprise the public aspect of Jennings' legacy to the Village of Lloyd Harbor.
