✓ Mayor's Message: FEMA reimbursement secured

The Mayor & Trustees are delighted to commend **Highway Superintendent Bob Schwarz** and **Village Clerk/Treasurer Jill Cervini** on assisting **Mayor Jean Thatcher** in successfully securing FEMA reimbursement of \$159,723. Highway Superintendent Schwarz and Clerk/Treasurer Cervini provided extensive and detailed information needed to finally obtain this very overdue FEMA reimbursement. These funds were due the Village subsequent to Hurricane Irene in 2011. The Village performed extensive erosion control and related roadwork on the Causeway due to this storm. All required documentation had long been provided. The delay was caused by an Agency attempt to support a different agenda, having nothing whatsoever to do with the Village's storm related work. **On behalf of all residents, the Mayor extends personal thanks to Bob Schwarz and Jill Cervini for their hard work.**



✓ Deer Management

Deer management will commence January 2018 and continue through March 2018. The DEC mandates bow-hunting season as October 1st – January 31st. Bow hunters are permitted on **private property only, and only with the permission of the landowner.**

Note: Residents must notify the LH Police Dept. (631-549-8220) if you are allowing a bow-hunter on your property. Please provide the name & hunting license number of the individual. Hunters must check in with the Lloyd Harbor Police each and every time he/she enters the Village.

✓ Dogs & Electric Fences

***Electric fence setbacks**

Minimum of 30 feet from the edge of any paved roadway adjoining the premises and a minimum of 20 feet from every other boundary line of the property.

***Leash Law**

The Village has a Leash Law for good reason. Off leash dogs, regardless of whether they are friendly, can engender a defensive reaction when approaching a leashed dog. This can result in a nasty confrontation. All dogs must be leashed when off your property!

*Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA)

The Board of Zoning Appeals has an opening for a Board member. The BZA is charged with hearing applications for code variances and related issues. Meetings are on a regular basis, the **4th Wednesday of the month, 6:30 pm.**



***Please note**- Driveways must be plowed & sanded to assure garbage pick-up. In order to avoid injuries to the crew and damage to equipment, sanitation trucks cannot enter driveways that are blocked or where icy conditions exist.
